1. The principle purpose for requesting the information on this form is to issue a parking permit in accordance with the parking regulations.
2. This information is solicited in accordance with the University policy adopted pursuant to Article IX, Section 9 of the California Constitution and is in accordance with the California Vehicle Code 21113 a
3. Furnishing each item of the information requested on this form is mandatory (except where noted on the form.) Failure to provide the requested information will delay or may prevent completion of the parking permit application process.
4. Information furnished on this form may be used by various university departments as required in the regular course of business and may be transmitted to State or Federal Government agencies as required by law.

Parking Permit Rules & Regulations

All parking permits (sticker permits) must be properly displayed while parked at the UC Merced Campus. The permit must be clearly visible of all tint, or dash board, placed in the lower left hand corner of the front windshield. Failure to display your sticker permit will result with a citation.

All hanging permits must be face-up, hanging off the rear view mirror, or face-up on the dash board. Failure to display this permit properly may result with a citation.

Your parking permit must be updated with the most current information. If you need to add any other vehicles, you may do so by emailing taps, taps@ucmerced.edu.

As a UC Merced permit holder, you are entitled to a copy of these rules and regulations by visiting the TAPS website: taps.ucmerced.edu.

You must park in the designated parking lots associated with your permit type. Failure to park in the designated lot will result with a citation.

It is your responsibility to ensure that you are correctly displaying your current parking permit and parking in a designated parking space in the correct parking lot.

University Discipline for Permit Abuse

Altered and Stolen Permits

Possession of an unauthorized permit may result in criminal charges (fraud) in accordance with the California Penal Code 488 or 496 (Petty Theft or Receiving and/or Possession of Stolen Properties). Students in possession of an unauthorized permit will be reported to the Office of Student Conduct for disciplinary action. A permit is considered lost or stolen when the original purchaser reports it as stolen, missing, or destroyed to:

UC Merced Transportation and Parking Services. Any permit with changes to the shape, color, working, design, or designation is an altered permit. The reproduction of any permit is **not** permitted.
